

Celebrating 100 Years



The Middle Tennessee Council is launching an 8-set of BSA Centennial collector patches for an exclusive set of council activities. Below are the details for each of them.



Centennial Celebration - 100 concurrent "Anniversary Celebrations" in over 100 locations on February 6, 2010. Beginning at 2:45 PM, all venues will report their attendance. At 3 PM, all assembled Scouts, Alumni, and families will simultaneously join in the Pledge of Allegiance, an Invocation, and all the Scouting oaths in Chronological order. Venues will also be able to share photos, etc. with all the other venues through a variety of social media options.



Each site can opt to receive this commemorative patch, a color program, and a birthday cake for each site. All the host unit has to do is collect \$3 per person for their venue. If you prefer not to collect the cost of the patch and program, we can send you the program to copy, and those who wish to purchase the patch, may do so at the Scout Shops, for \$3.



All other activities for that day/time are up to the individual venues to determine. See below about how Scouting for Food 2010 ties into this activity.

Centennial Summer Camps – this patch will be given primarily through Boxwell Scout Reservation as the Boy Scout Camp early bird patch and the Cub & Webelos Resident Camps participation patch.



Centennial Day Camp – given to all Cub Scouts, Den Chiefs and volunteers participating at this summer's Day Camps.

Centennial Staff – given to the lead volunteers at the Centennial Celebrations and the Centennial Jamboree.



Centennial Recruiter – given to Scouts who recruit another Scout through Spring & Fall Peer-to-Peer programs - limited to the first 1,000 Scouts.

Centennial Geocaching – limited to the first 2,500 geocachers who complete the Adventures of Scouting geocache series and are registered members of the Middle Tennessee Council, BSA. Centennial Jamboree – given to all Scouts and Leaders who participate in the Council's Centennial Jamboree at the Wilson County Fairgrounds from October 8 - 10, 2010. Make plans now to be there and be a part of the largest Centennial activity in the Middle Tennessee Council.

Centennial Service – given to Scouts who bring food to the Centennial Celebrations on February 6, 2010. This is the only Scouting for Food patch provided by the council in 2010. Look for more information on an upcoming fall service project.
