What is University of Scouting (UoS)?

The University of Scouting is a one-day *supplemental* training opportunity for all adult volunteer Scouters. Supplemental training goes beyond Fast Start, Specific and Advanced Training to give Scouters knowledge & skills on specific topics to help them deliver the promise of scouting to their youth. Our goal is to offer additional classes that help you as a leader now instead of you finding out the information years later. Our experienced instructors will provide you with both skills and insights into how to deliver the Scouting promise. It is also a great opportunity to network with other Scouters and make new friends.

What will I do at University of Scouting?

You will take specialized classes towards earning either a Bachelors / Masters/ or Doctorate Degree from Cub Scout, Boy Scout and/or Venturing Colleges. See degree requirements on page 18.

How do I Register?

Online registration opens on **November 14, 2011**. To register go to www.mtcbsa.org. The cost for the UoS is \$25 for participants and instructors, which includes a patch, water-bottle, special gift, lunch and a Degree Certificate. Instructors will also receive a special 2012 UoS cap.

How Can I Volunteer to Teach at UoS?

Volunteer instructors are assigned by the Dean from each College. Instructors will receive credit hours for instructional classes taught. Three hours of instruction time is required to earn a Doctors Degree. All who have a Masters should immediately contact the College Deans of their choice to volunteer as an instructor.

CSC 111 Webelos to Scouts**1 Webelos to Scout Transition**

Crossing over is an essential part of the Cub Scout/Boy Scout program. The most important job and difficult challenge of all is turning your Cub Scout into a Boy Scout. Find out about the transition process, how the program works with scouts and adult roles. Learn how to assist your scouts and their parents in making the most important transition in their scouting career. Design a balanced, goal oriented schedule to earn the Webelos badge, Arrow of Light award, and how to find the right troop for each scout. This Course is a 3 hour class covering the rules and regulations, the range rules, how to setup a range safely and how to be safe on and off the range so all those participating are safe and have fun in both Archery and BB-gun programs.

CSC 601 Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation**6 BALOO**

This energetic training will provide the necessary knowledge and skills for a pack to be able to go family camping in the Middle Tennessee Council. It will cover everything you need to know to plan and run an overnigher. BALOO is more than just camping; it includes: Ideas for outdoor activities, games and ceremonies; Information on selecting and using camping equipment; How to run a campfire program; and Hands-on Cub Scout cooking demonstrations. Participants will be making their own lunch. Each pack is required to have a BALOO trained individual on every family campout.

BSC 101	Dealing with Behavior Issues	1	Unit Enhancement
Problems in the Troop? This course will address approaches for minimizing and managing behavioral issues and how to determine when unacceptable behavior merits separation from the Scouting program.			
BSC 102	Implementing Journey to Excellence	1	Unit Enhancement
If you enjoyed the Quality Unit Program, you will love Journey to Excellence! This course will address how to integrate the new Journey to Excellence program within troop planning and how to work with the required documentation. It's really not that hard.			
BSC 103	Service Projects	1	Skills
The course will discuss the essentials of service to others and provide project suggestions for regular rank advancement, merit badge requirements (i.e., Citizenship), and Eagle Scout projects. Rank advancement and helping other Scouts, parents, units, sponsors and the community.			
BSC 106	Troop Quartermaster System	1	Food and Cooking
This session will outline the needs and general requirements for a safe and efficient system for a troop quartermaster to care for, repair, and keep track of the Troop camping equipment.			
BSC 107	Eagle Board of Review	1	Advancement
The Eagle Board of Review is the final gateway to the pinnacle of Scouting and proper preparation is necessary on the part of both the Scout and Leaders . This course will cover the purpose, requirements and outline of the Eagle Board of Review. Preparation for the Board of Review by Candidates, Leaders and Board Members will be discussed.			
BSC 108	Troop Court of Honor	1	Advancement
The Court of Honor can be a source of pride and motivation not only for Scouts, but for parents/guardians as well. This course will focus on the "How To" in running a Troop Court of Honor. The scope will include planning, setup, program ideas and resources, and delegating tasks.			
BSC 109	The Essentials of Troop Communications	1	Unit Enhancement
Effective communications is the lifeblood of any Scouting program and must be implemented at multiple levels to accommodate the capabilities of those sending and receiving the information. This course will address ways to get Parents involved through various methods of communications and activities.			
BSC 110	Troop Board of Review	1	Advancement
The Board of Review provides a special opportunity for validating the experience of advancing Scouts and motivating them to greater achievement. This course will address the purpose and requirements of the Board of Review and "how to" suggestions for making the review more effective in attaining its greater purposes.			
BSC 111	The Scoutmaster Conference	1	Advancement
This course reviews the requirements and purpose of Scoutmaster's conferences and explores ways to make the conferences valuable to both the Scout and the Scoutmaster. Ideas for and approaches to the Scoutmaster conference with Scouts all the way through Eagle will be presented.			
BSC 112	Recruiting New Scouts	1	Unit Enhancement
No recruitment? No Scouts. This course will discuss tips and strategies for recruiting and attracting new scouts. Gain insights into methods of increasing your Troop size through Troop activities and marketing in your area.			



BSC 202 Hiking Opportunities in Middle TN 2 Adventure

We are blessed in TN with wonderful outdoor resources. This course will identify and describe great places to go hiking in the Middle TN Area. The principal focus will be on 10- and 20-mile hikes associated with the Hiking Merit Badge.

BSC 204 Geocaching for Troops 1 Skills

Every Scout loves his electronics and geocaching is a great way to combine modern technology and Scouting skills. This course will address geocaching at a level appropriate to Boy Scouts. In addition to the basics, individual and troop activities will be discussed as a means for recruiting and retention, as well as supporting the requirements of the Geocaching Merit Badge.

BSC 205 Trail Cooking 2 Food and Cooking

Trail cooking involves unique tradeoffs considering weight, efficiency and food quality. Topics to be addressed in this course will include planning and preparation, the types of foods best suited for life on the trail, gear to be used in the preparation and cleanup procedures. In the second hour some meal samples will be prepared and enjoyed.

BSC 240 Webelos to Boy Scouts 2 Unit Enhancement

Graduating Webelos represent the greatest opportunity for maintaining the vitality of a Troop. This course discusses ways to ensure successful integration of Webelos into your Troop. You will gain insights into ways to prepare Webelos Scouts and their Parents to ensure the transition is fun and meaningful, leading to continuation into Scouting.

BSC 250 The Patrol Method 2 Leadership

First implemented by Baden-Powell, the Patrol Method is fundamental to Scouting, but requires understanding and commitment on the part of both Leaders and Scouts. This course discusses the patrol method, showing how boy leaders can run their troop through the Patrol Leader's Council. Gain insights into how successful troops use the patrol method to help each Scout and Scouter develop his leadership abilities.

BSC 305 Dutch Oven Cooking 3 Food and Cooking

This course will provide information regarding dutch oven cooking ideas for improving your camp cuisine and teaching cooking skills to your Troop. It includes a hands-on demonstration in which students will prepare and enjoy their noon meal.

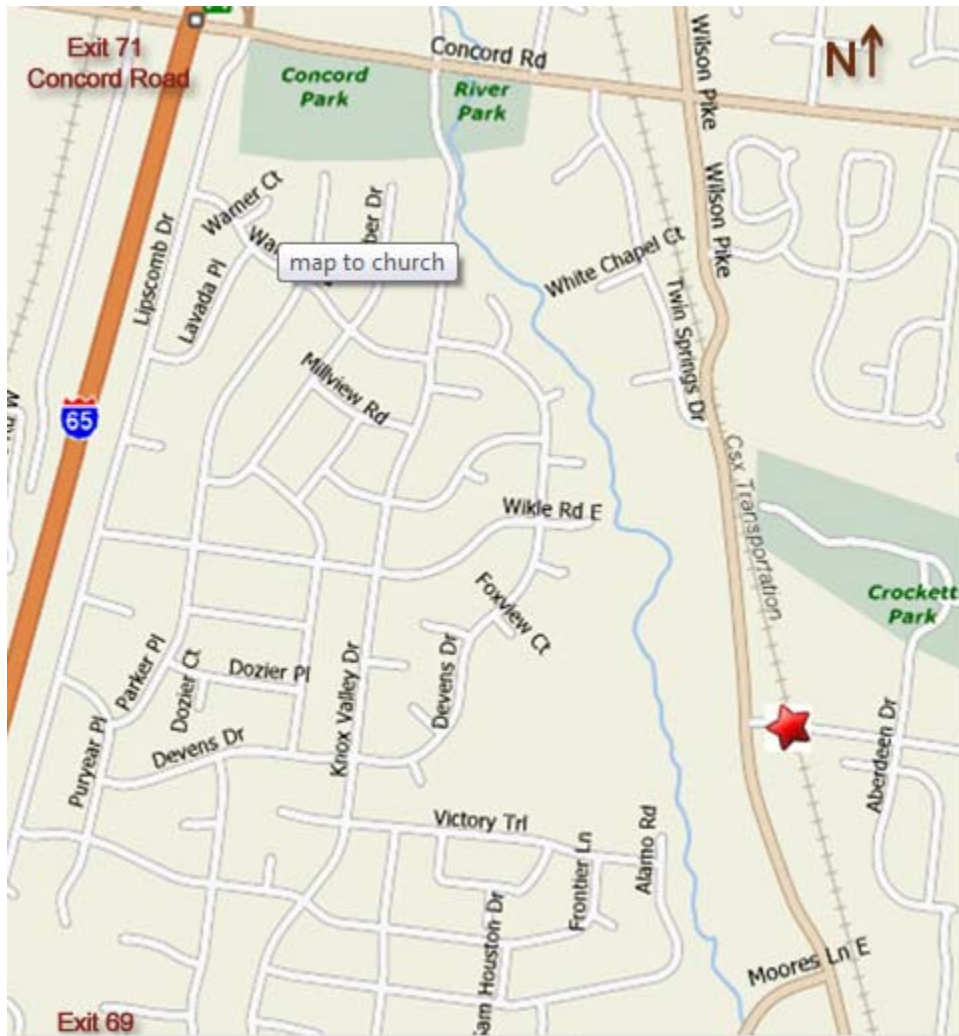

DEGREE INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

Bachelor Degree Requirements:

- Scouters must earn at least six credit hours, of which 4 are from their prospective College of Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting or Venturing.
- Scouters must be trained in their registered position.

Master Degree Requirements:

- Scouters must have earned a bachelor degree.
- Scouters must earn an additional six credit hours.

Doctorate Degree Requirements:

- Scouters completing a Master’s degree in any scout area are eligible to pursue a Doctorate degree.
- Scouters must have earned their Wood Badge beads (please display to UoS Chancellor) or submit an application after earning your beads.
- Scouters must complete an additional three credit hours in the college of their choice since earning their Master’s degree
- Teach University of Scouting courses totaling three credit hours since earning their Master’s degree.

NOTE: We will consider credits from other Universities towards Bachelors and Masters degrees. Please submit documentation and request for credit to Chancellor PRIOR to 1 February 2012.
