Carla's dedication to scouting and youth was exemplary. When Carla was in Williamson Medical Center or home recovering from a kidney transplant, her tireless efforts were unmatched as she continued working on the scouting movement either by phone, email or in person. Carla has directly or indirectly impacted and touched the lives of hundreds if not thousands of youth and adults in her 20 plus years in scouting.

In early 2000s, to make the Natchez Trace Cub Scout Day Camp (BGA Campus) the best program for the youth, Carla utilized her resources and pulled two scouters who are both Silver Beavers with over 80 years in scouting combined from Alameda Council to assist with the program.

When I left my life long home in California to work with Franklin Fire Department, Carla was quick to keep me involved in scouting and utilize my years of scouting service to get me into the Middle Tennessee scouting family as an explored post advisor and range instructor. She was also instrumental in arranging den meetings for the cubs to visit the Fire Department each year that I would teach.

RULES AND REGULATIONS of the BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

Article X, Section 6, Clause 3 Silver Beaver Award

The Boy Scouts of America, acting through the National Court of Honor, may award the Silver Beaver for distinguished service to youth upon the following basis and procedure:

- a) Each local council may process their own annual allotment of Silver Beaver awards and shall send a list of Silver Beaver recipients presented each calendar year to the National Court of Honor no later than January 31 of the following year.
- b) The award is made for noteworthy service of exceptional character to youth by registered Scouters within the territory under the jurisdiction of a local council.
- c) As evidence of the award there shall be presented: a suitable certificate, duly authenticated by the Boy Scouts of America, pursuant to the action of the National Court of Honor; and a miniature Silver Beaver suspended by a blue, white, and blue ribbon to be worn around the neck.
- d) It shall be a general policy that no public announcements shall be made by the local council in advance of action by the National Court of Honor with reference to names presented for consideration.
- e) These awards shall be made to the recipients by the local council concerned in connection with its annual meeting or other public location.
- f) Each duly chartered local council shall be entitled to one nomination. Councils having more than 60 units shall be entitled to further nominations on the basis of one for each additional 60 units or fraction thereof in their territory, as of December 31 preceding the nomination, according to the records of the national office.
- g) Councils not using their full allotment in any year may accumulate the unused portion for use in any subsequent year.
- h) In extraordinary cases, the Silver Beaver Award may be made by the National Court of Honor to a Scouter upon the recommendation of the duly constituted Scouting authorities having supervision of one or more units of the Boy Scouts of America, located outside of the United States and not under the jurisdiction of a local council.

As I am compiling this letter, I have a heavy heart due to the loss of a close friend, extended family member and very notable Scouter, Carla Witt.

When I moved to Franklin in 1998 to work with Franklin Fire Department, I was introduced to my Captain Bill Witt's family, Carla, Phillip and Lee. Carla was a very involved Scout Leader with her son Phillip starting in 1997. Upon learning of my Scouting background, Carla immediately started working with me to get involved with MTCBSA. Through the years my involvement was in support of BSA units or projects the Carla was involved with. These were assisting her with Cub Scout Days camps, trainings or Fire Station tours for Packs and Troops.

I will tell you that due to Carla having her Kidney surgery, she was under strict medical guidelines of care and medicines. When COVID arrived ,it put another strain on her physical wellbeing. However, Carla knowing that she was at extreme risk did not deter her from continuing the many rolls and dedication to the Scouting movement. Carla continued this dedication to Scouting until her passing from COVID in 2021.

I can be said that Carla risked her life for her notable passions, mostly the Boy Scouts of America Middle Tennessee Council. There is no question in my mind that if Carla Witt had not passed away, that she would still be attending Scout Camp, Cub Camps, Camporee and assisting with council activities. Carla would pick up the phone whenever Middle Tennessee Council called and needed a volunteer that they were sure would get the job done. Carla was excited that my son Bennett was starting in his scouting experience and if she was able, would be keeping a watchful eye on his pack and my leadership roles within the council. I don't doubt that she would be involved with his Pack,131 Franklin.

In closing, I am respectfully asking that the council bestow the award of Silver Beaver to Carla Witt as she is a very deserving Scout who was dedicated and never backed away from Scouting. In my opinion, this award is well deserved and will mean the world to her family, friends and fellow scouters.

Friends' Scouting journey started in kindergarten and ended at the top rank

FRANKLIN — When three friends joined the Den 135 Tiger Cubs in kindergarten, they never expected that 13 years later, they'd reach the end of their Boy Scout experience together.

Kirk Wells, Spencer White and Lee Witt, who advanced from Tiger Cubs to being members of Boy Scout Troop 13, received their Eagle rank, the highest award in Scouting, in a joint ceremony Aug. 15 at Oak View Elementary School.

"Because of the rules, they had to do separate community service projects. They have to plan their projects and do most of the work themselves. But they've always been such good friends that when they could ask for volunteers, they helped each other out," said Spencer's mother, Angela White.

A 2010 Page High School graduate, Spencer built an archery box to hold bows and arrows at Winstead Elementary School, which received a grant from the county to teach the school children the sport. This archery box, built from scratch with heavy-duty plywood, was placed on wheels so it could be moved to the field as a station to distribute the bows and arrows.

The son of Angela and Steve White, Spencer will attend the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga.
His friend Lee designed and built life-

Carla served and contributed on the Council Health and safety committee throughout the year.

While Carla served in these capacities, we never had any serious situations that resulted in bad injuries.

Thanks to her efforts we had one of the best clinic's in the country and that was proven by both the National and State inspection each year.
