Do you want to be a better youth leader? Join us for the 2020 University of Scouting on Saturday, November 14th, from 8 AM - 4 PM at Boxwell Scout Reservation. You may also earn your degree safe in your own home's comfort with our Zoom Classes. This catalog provides degree requirements and trek descriptions to assist participants with online registration. What is the University of Scouting?

The University of Scouting (UoS) is Middle Tennessee Council's premier one-day supplemental training opportunity for all registered adult Scout leaders. UoS goes beyond Fast Start, Specific, and even Advanced Training to give Scout Leaders the knowledge & skills on specific topics that will help them in their efforts to deliver the promise of Scouting. UoS Instructors have skills and insights that have developed through years of scouting experience. UoS is also an excellent opportunity to network with other Scout leaders, make new friends, and share best practices across the Council.

What will I do at UoS?

UoS is structured so that you can take classes and earn a Bachelor, Masters, or Doctorate Degree in Scout Leadership, or you can simply take the Treks of interest to you without earning a degree. The specific degree requirements are found in this Catalog.

How Do I Register?

Online registration opens on or about **September 18th**. To register, go to www.mtcbsa.org and click on the training tab. Through Sunday, **October 31st**, the cost for UoS is \$25 for in-person Boxwell Trek participants, which includes a UoS patch, lunch, a Degree Certificate, and a 2020 UoS memento. **After October 31st, 2020, the registration cost increases to \$35.** During online registration, you will select your classes, degree choice, and make your lunch selection. **UoS online registration will close on November 8th at midnight. THERE WILL BE NO WALK-ONS.** Please arrive at 8:00 am to Boxwell to start your day.

Zoom registration cost will be \$15 per person through Sunday, November 1st, after that will be \$20 a person will also close at midnight November 8th to allow instructors to contact participants. Zoom participants will also receive a patch and certificate.

NOTE: A valid email address is required when registering to receive important details ahead of the event. Your valid email address will allow us to keep you informed of ANY changes and updates as we prepare for the event.

How Can I Volunteer to Teach or Serve as Staff for UoS?

The College Deans select volunteer instructors for their courses. Instructors receive credit hours for classes taught. If you have a particular topic that you would like to instruct at UoS, contact the Dean of the applicable College. Their contact information is found at the end of this catalog.

DEGREE INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

Bachelor Degree Requirements:

- Scouters must earn at least six credit hours from the courses offered in UoS. Any combination of courses from the four colleges is acceptable.
- Scouters must be trained in their registered position.

Master Degree Requirements:

- Scouters must have earned a UoS Bachelor degree.
- Scouters must earn an additional six credit hours since earning their Bachelor degree.

Doctorate Degree Requirements:

- Doctorate Candidates should complete the application at the end of this catalog and submit it to the Chancellor before the 2020 UoS. Earning your Wood Badge beads is a requirement of a Doctorate.

If you require instructor hours to complete your degree, you will need to contact the Deans to arrange to teach a class. Their contact information is found below.

NOTE: Credits from other Universities towards Bachelor's and Master's degrees will be considered by the Chancellor. Please submit your request via double knot. Core Training and Leader Specific Training Courses do not count toward degree requirements. There is not a degree award structure for youth participants at this time. However, youth will receive a UOS participant patch.





The University of Scouting - Application for Doctorate

Doctorate Degree Requirements:

- Scouters must have completed a UoS Master’s degree.
- Scouters must have earned their Wood Badge beads or apply after earning their beads.
- Scouters must earn an additional six credit hours since earning their Master degree, including at least three credits from the teaching requirement below.
- Scouters must teach University of Scouting courses totaling three credit hours since earning their Master’s degree or, with the current UoS Chancellor’s approval, serve on the UoS Staff.
- Doctorate candidates should complete this application and submit it to the Chancellor before the 2020 UoS.

COVID PRECAUTIONS

Working with the Council, we have developed a plan that takes all current guidance for gatherings, social distancing, and use of masks as provided by the Centers for Disease Control, the State of Tennessee (The Tennessee Pledge), and the Middle Tennessee Council. Attendees will be screened (including a temperature check) upon entrance to Boxwell Reservation. Any gatherings will have no more than 50 people, social distancing and mask usage will be required, food will be served in individual containers, and indoor facilities will be minimally used.

- *While precautions will be taken, by attending or allowing your minor youth to participate in this event, you acknowledge the contagious nature of COVID-19 and voluntarily assume the risk of exposure to or infection of COVID-19 by attendance; and that such exposure or infection may result in personal injury, illness, permanent disability, and/or death. You understand that the risk of becoming exposed to or infected by COVID-19 at Boxwell may result from the actions, omissions, or negligence of you, your minor youth, and others, including, but not limited to, MTC employees, volunteers, and program participants and their families.*
- *All attendees of the event must follow all safety precautions as directed by event staff. Failure to follow safety precautions is disrespectful to all event participants' safety and will result in dismissal.*
- *Everyone must bring a durable protective mask and personal-size hand sanitizer for use when required or desired. Please note that masks must cover the nose and mouth and be solid masks without open mesh or holes or other issues which would prevent their effectiveness. Face-shields will not be allowed unless there is a documented medical reason for its use rather than a durable protective face mask.*
- *Everyone is required to bring a mask and wear it when they are either within 6 feet of another person or indoors. Should you go indoors for any reason, a mask is required at all times, 6 feet apart or not.*
- *You will need to complete a pre-event medical screening form upon arrival and pass a temperature check at the gate. Please note that we will turn away anyone who does not pass those tests. If you feel sick or have symptoms of any kind, please do not come to the event for the safety of you, us, and our community.*

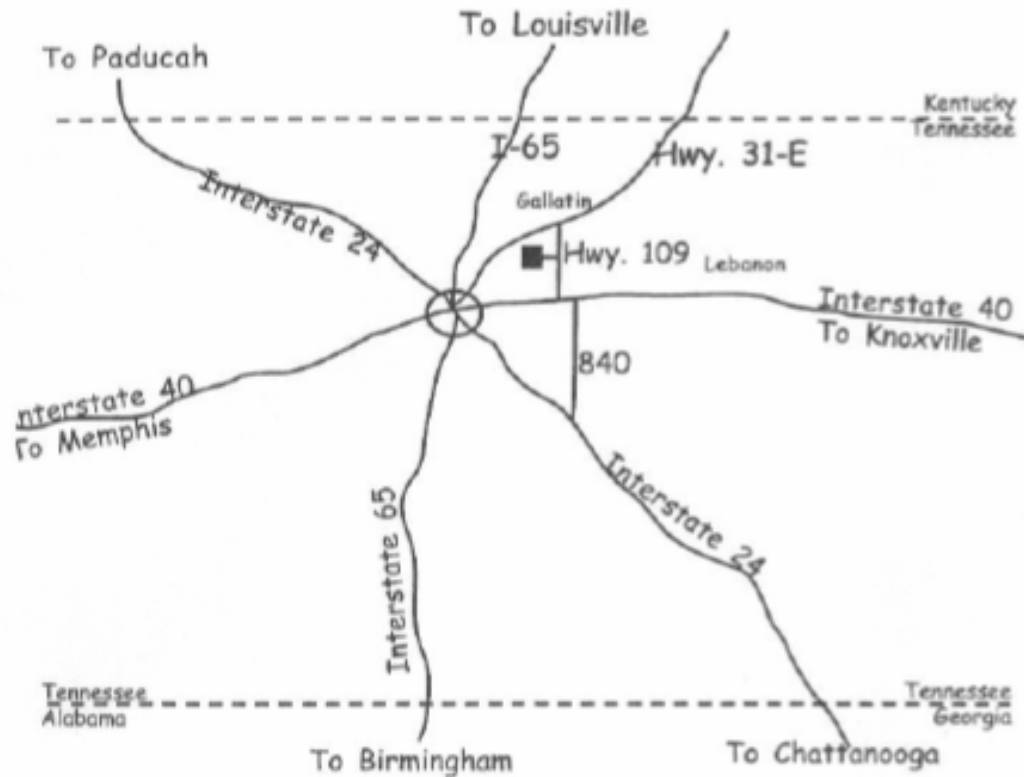

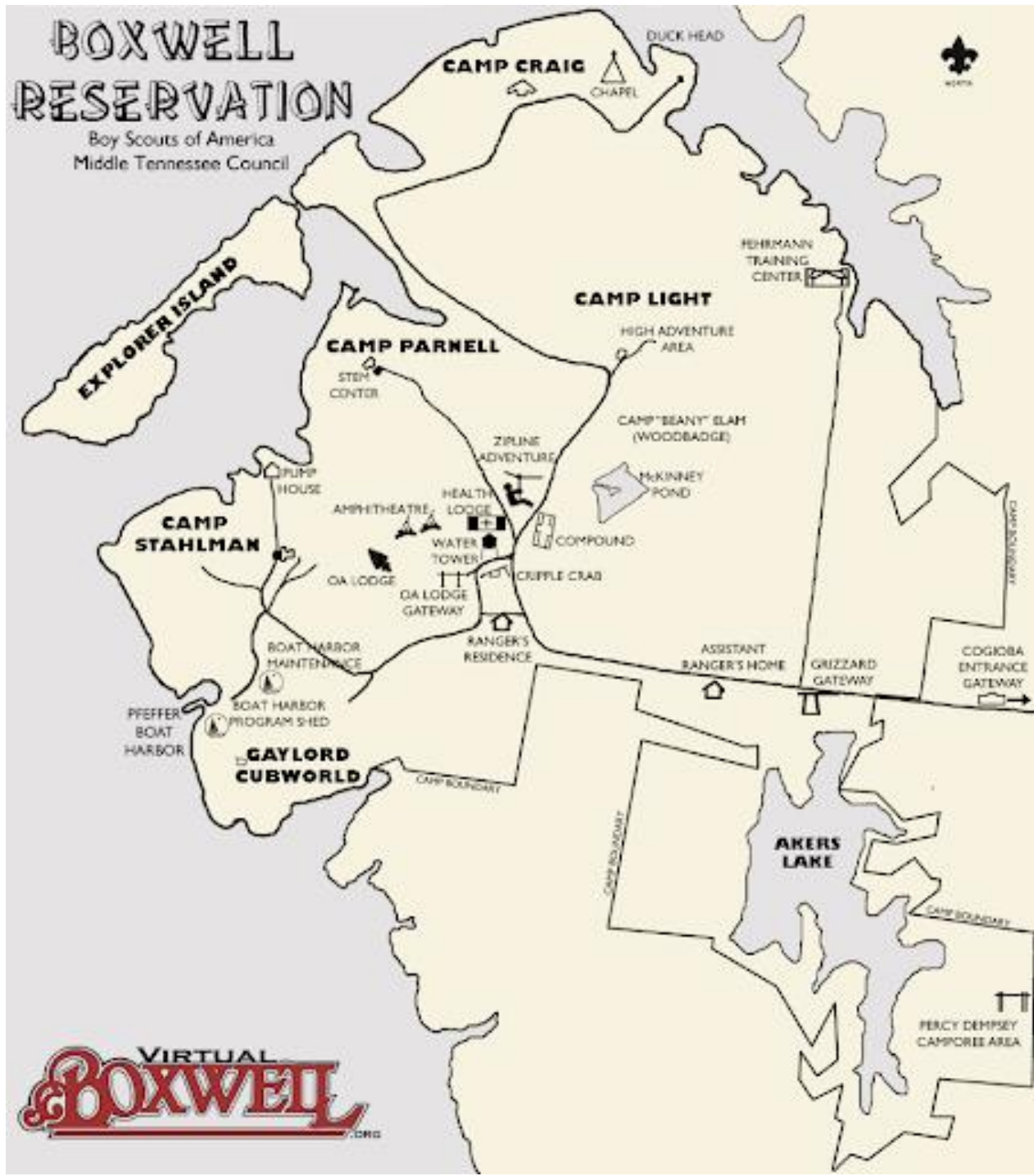

From I-40:	Exit at Hwy 109 (Exit 232B) and travel north 9.2 miles. Turn left on Creighton Lane (Boxwell Reservation sign)
From I-65N:	From North of Nashville – Take Vietnam Veterans Parkway, State Route 386 which turn into State Route 174 Long Hollow Pike, turn right onto Hwy 109 Bypass East, go 3 miles to Hwy 109 South towards Lebanon, go approximately 4 miles turning right at Boxwell Reservation sign.
	From South of Nashville (I-65 or I-24) Exit SR-840. Take East towards Murfreesboro, Lebanon, Knoxville. Exit at Highway 109. Take North approximately 11 miles. Turn left at Boxwell Reservation.
From I-65S:	Exit Long Hollow Pike and turn left. Turn right onto Conference Dr. Turn left on Vietnam Veterans Boulevard. Follow directions above.
	If coming from KY, Exit at TN-25 (Exit #112). Turn right and take towards Gallatin. Turn right onto Hwy 109 S. Boxwell will be on the right.
From I-24:	From Clarksville – Take I-24 East to Nashville. Take I-65 North to Vietnam Veterans Blvd. Follow directions above for I-65 N.
From 840:	From Murfreesboro exit 72B, State Route 265, Central Pike, turns into State Route 109 N. Go 13 miles towards Gallatin, to Creighton Lane, turn left at Boxwell Reservation sign on left.
